

## ENBIS AWARDS 2018: EXTENDED NOMINATIONS DEADLINE

The ENBIS Awards Committee chaired by our President-Elect Murat Caner Testik has been collecting nominations for the Box Medal, Best Manager Award and Young Statistician Award since December 5th, 2017. **The deadline for nominations which expired on Monday, January 8th, has now been extended for another week: the new and final nominations submission deadline is Monday, January 15th, 2018.** Please e-mail your nominations to [murat.testik@gmail.com](mailto:murat.testik@gmail.com). Every nomination should be accompanied by a short explanation of reasons for nomination and links to publicly available information (such as personal website, project and/or publications list, CV, etc.) of the nominated candidate. ### Box Medal for Outstanding Contributions to Industrial Statistics

The Box Medal is named after George Box and recognises each year an extraordinary statistician who has remarkably contributed with his/her work to the development and the application of statistical methods in European business and industry.

ENBIS members can nominate statisticians who influenced the applications of Statistics in European business and industry, regardless of their ENBIS affiliation.

The candidate for the Box Medal should be of such renown that his/her work is generally known. Nevertheless, please do provide the Awards Committee with a short CV of the nominated candidate as well as the list of his/her most relevant publications.

### Best Manager Award

The Best Manager Award is meant to recognise managers who gave a significant contribution to the success of their companies by advancing the spread and the practice of Statistics in them.

By the deadline set by the Best Manager Award Committee, people can nominate managers or even themselves, provided that at least one person (nominee and/or nominating person) is an ENBIS member. Submissions are possible only in electronic format. The following documentation should be submitted:

- an extended candidate presentation (at least 3 pages, with all relevant evidence, possibly a CV) by at least one ENBIS member.

### **Young Statistician Award**

The Young Statistician Award is aimed to recognise the work of young people in introducing innovative methods, promoting the use of Statistics and/or successfully using it in the daily practice. People from both academic and industrial world are encouraged to participate.

By the deadline set by the Young Statistician Award Committee, people can nominate young statisticians or even themselves, provided that at least one person (nominee and/or nominating person) is an ENBIS member. Submissions are possible only in electronic format. The following documentation should be submitted:

- proof of age (candidate should be younger than 35 at the submission deadline);
- recommendation letter from at least one other statistician (provided he/she and/or the nominee is an ENBIS member);
- publications (dissertations, reports, papers, detailed descriptions of activities and projects) [ENBIS is aware that submitting »papers« by people involved in industrial, non academic activities is not easy (because of confidentiality, different priorities in industries rather than in academic world where »publishing« is a key goal.). The Young Statistician Award Committee will take in consideration these aspects and therefore ENBIS encourages young statisticians working in companies to apply and submit enough evidence to be evaluated];
- any »evidence« (web page of projects, patents, etc.) which could be useful to evaluate the candidate's contributions;
- extended abstract (3 pages) and title of a paper the candidate would like to present at the next ENBIS annual conference.
